

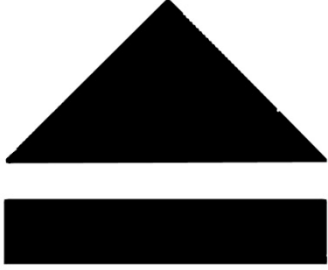
GRAFFITI STENCILS

A step by step guide by



STEP 1

Choose a stencil (hi res versions are included in this document)



Stencil 1: Eject by Asim Butt

This graffiti was popularized in 2007 by Butt. He painted it red and said it symbolized the need to eject the military from the presidency.

Stencil 3: Awaz Uthao,

Step 2

For A4 size stencils: print the stencil on A4 paper.

For bigger stencils, download the .pdf or .jpeg file. Open it in any photo editor and resize it to your required dimensions. Print it out using www.blockposters.com

Step 3

Paste your printout(s) on cardboard or card paper. OR use carbon paper to trace the outline of your stencil on the cardboard/card paper.

Using scissors or a paper cutter, carefully cut out all of the black sections until you are left with the outline. Do not miss the tiny parts!

Step 4

Get out that can of spray! Spray paint your heart out, and send us pictures of your vandalisms at forallpakistan@gmail.com

Hat tip 1

For bigger stencils, you can also go to your closest printing shop and they will take care of everything from the resizing to the cutting. You can experiment with materials and get you custom size to the last pixel.

Do

- Carry your spray paints and stencils in the trunk of your car. You never know when you might run into a particularly soul-less wall or inspirational moment.
- Come up with your own slogans and stencils. Spray them all over your neighbourhood.
- Maintain anonymity.

Do Not

- Paint on residential walls, unless you have permission to do so.
- Paint on sites of worship, religious spaces, art installations, monuments, landmarks, billboards.
- Paint over someone else's graffiti, unless you are adding to it in meaningful way.
